MAS Consolidation Overview



BLUF (Bottom Line Up Front)

- No major impact on buyers throughout the consolidation process
 - No impact to existing orders
- Contract number does not change
- Period of Performance does not change
- Companies with more than one Schedule contract will be consolidated to one contract in Phase III – beg. August 2020
- No SINs have been completely cancelled
 - SINs were consolidated from 881 to 317 NAICS based SINs
 - Review SIN Mapping Spreadsheet
 - Contractor must have SIN awarded by GSA CO in order to offer
- 12 Large Categories and 83 Subcategories



- More streamlined process for finding and acquiring the products, services, and solutions needed to meet mission requirements under the new NAICS-based SIN structure
- NAICS based SINs simplify scope determination process and alignment with appropriate industry partners
- Easier for buyers to identify the NAICS for the order
- Easier process to view and understand Schedule contract terms and conditions
- Industry will have a single point-of-entry for the GSA Schedule program



What do we call the new Schedule?

MAS Large Category - Subcategory (if applicable) – for example:

- MAS Information Technology (MAS IT)
- MAS Information Technology IT Hardware (MAS IT Hardware)
- MAS Professional Services Engineering
- MAS Facilities Facilities Services





Available Offerings and Requirements

The Multiple Award Schedule (MAS or the Schedule) is broken into Large Categories, Subcategories, and Special Item Numbers (SINs) that have corresponding North American Industrial Classification Codes (NAICS).

To identify the large categories, subcategories, and SINs that may apply to your company, please view the **Available Offerings**Attachment [XLSX - 365 KB].

The MAS solicitation outlines requirements for all offerors, including the required information you must attack that to be considered for a Schedule contract. In addition, some large categories, subcategories or SINs have unique required templates and attachments that may be required as part of your offer. This additional information is used to better and confirm you are ready to do business with the Federal government. Below is an outline of the attachments a may be required to submit with your offer.

For more information on the applicability of each template or attachment, please refer to SCP-FSS-001 under section I of the MAS solicitation and each applicable "Large Category Attachment" related to your offerings. In addition to specific attachments, there may be clauses or additional instructions specific to your offerings outlined in those documents.

Solicitation Attachments and Templates - Complete offering requirements and information are provided in the MAS solicitation and large Category attachments. Templates, attachments, and critical information referenced in the solicitation are provided below for use. Please reference solicitation documents for further instruction.

How will the MAS Consolidation affect ordering?



MAS Consolidation and Ordering

- Contract numbers are NOT changing
- No need to recompete or move orders
- Legacy Schedule contracts will remain in place until existing BPAs are cancelled or expired
- Buyers should post new RFQs under the new SINs in GSA eBuy
 - GSA has incorporated back-end mapping under the new SINs, so the corresponding legacy SIN contractor group will also receive the RFQ
 - Agencies can post RFQs on GSA eBuy under legacy SINs until they are sunset beginning in August 2020





OASIS Business Volume

OASIS U and OASIS SB have been widely adopted.

- Task orders awarded: Over 2,200
- Total obligations: \$24 Billion
- Percentage of task orders awarded to small business: 70%
- Percentage of dollars obligated to small business: 43%

OASIS UNR - 5 Years In

- 91 contractors across seven pools for a total of 250 contracts
- ~ \$14 billion in obligations
 - 15% is firm-fixed price
 - 35% is cost-plus-fixed fee
 - 7% is time and materials
 - 43% are hybrid contract types

OASIS SB - 5 Years In

- 227 contractors across seven pools for a total of 321 contracts
- ~\$10.5 billion in obligations
 - 38% is firm-fixed price
 - 45% is cost-plus-fixed fee
 - 10% is time and materials
 - 7% are hybrid contract types



8(a) On-Ramps

- 8(a) Only contracts for OASIS Pools 1,2,3,4,5b,6
 - This allows for both sole source (direct) awards and competitive awards to qualified 8(a) Only contractors
 - Offer/Acceptance with SBA not required for competitive orders (this was done at the ID/IQ level)
 - Offer/Acceptance with SBA required for Sole Source (direct) order awards.
 - Current sole source (direct) order threshold
 - \$4M
 - \$22M Alaska Native Corporation (ANC)/Tribal Owned
 - \$100M (DoD Only)-ANC/Tribal Owned/Native Hawaiian Organization (NHO)
