

What is the Services MAC?

- GSA's next best-in-class (BIC) multi-agency contract (MAC) for non-IT services
- Will provide federal agencies access to highly qualified contractors of all sizes through a single Tier III Best-in-Class (BIC) IDIQ
- Provides a unique opportunity for agency stakeholders to incorporate their requirements now or in the future

Scalable contract scope that includes a broad range of services



Streamline access to highly qualified industry partners



Leverage and improve competition at the task order level



Provide consistent & open opportunities for best-in-class contract participation



Foster business inclusion and growth in the federal services marketplace





Polaris



Polaris

- Polaris will be a small business set-aside multiple award Indefinite Delivery,
 Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract
- Builds upon the success of the now-expired Alliant Small Business IT GWAC by providing additional opportunities for various socio-economic groups
- Provides customer agencies an opportunity to meet all of their small business goals through the GSA Small Business IT GWAC portfolio
- Polaris will be structured to include four separate diverse small business pools -
 - Small Business (SB)
 - Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZone)
 - Women-Owned Small Business (WOSB)
 - Service-Disabled, Veteran-Owned Small Business (SDVOSB)



Polaris Scope

- Customers seeking customized IT services or an IT services-based solution from a Small Business, HUBZone, SDVOSB, or WOSB will have access to highly-qualified small businesses from these sectors who can:
 - Meet their IT mission objectives
 - Deliver small business program results



Polaris Strategy

The overarching strategy shaping our approach to Polaris includes:

- Provide greater opportunities to small businesses by removing barriers to entry and providing additional training and engagement with industry
- Support greater equity in government contracting
- Connect agencies with highly qualified technology providers
- Improve ease of use for agencies, industry partners, and GSA employees



Polaris Strategy (cont)

Key Polaris features:

- Regular refresh of the industrial base through more regular on-ramps
- Inclusion of a technical refresh clause that can be triggered as needed to adapt to customer needs
- Requested approval for:
 - Unpriced contracts with pricing negotiated at the task order level to promote competition
 - No contract ceiling
- 5-year base period with 5-year option
- Support for IT modernization and emerging technologies capabilities by offering the latest in cloud offerings from storage services to quantum computing services



Polaris Steps Taken

- GSA is undertaking a proactive and collaborative approach to expanding the engagement between GSA and the IT services small business community to improve current and future solicitations and contracts
- Market Research RFI with over 1,200 responses
- Draft RFP released on 12/31/20 (public comment period ended 1/29/21)
- In September, released an updated draft of the Polaris solicitation for sections L
 and M and the scorecard, and we welcome your feedback on those. The updated
 drafted is published to the Small Business GWAC page on GSA Interact Page and is
 open for responses until October 15th.
- GSA is also planning a GSA Polaris Industry Forum for Wednesday, October 20, and we encourage our small business industry partners to attend.
- And, finally, we're aiming for the final Polaris solicitation to be released in the coming months with a pre-proposal conference to follow shortly thereafter.

Multiple Award Schedule (MAS)



MAS Consolidation BLUF

- No major impact on buyers throughout the consolidation process
 - No impact to existing orders no need to recompete or move orders
- Contract number did not change
- Period of Performance did not change
- Companies with more than one contract will be consolidated to one contract in Phase III
 - Legacy Schedule contracts will remain in place until existing BPAs are cancelled or expired
- No SINs have been completely cancelled
 - SINs were consolidated from 881 to 329 NAICS based SINs
 - Review <u>SIN Mapping Spreadsheet</u>
- 12 Large Categories and 83 Subcategories
- Contractors must have the SIN awarded on their GSA Schedule in order to sell under it



Multiple Award Schedule (MAS)

- Phase III Consolidation (For companies with more than one contract)
 - Checklist Due December 31, 2021
 - Company chooses surviving contract
 - Non-surviving contracts will remain open to support any open BPAs
